Administered by the National Lottery Community Fund, the Coronavirus Support Fund has two key objectives: To increase community support to vulnerable people affected by the COVID-19 crisis, through the work of civil society organisations. To reduce temporary closures of essential charities & social enterprises, ensuring services for vulnerable people impacted by COVID-19 have the financial resources to operate, & so reduce the burden on public services...more info


